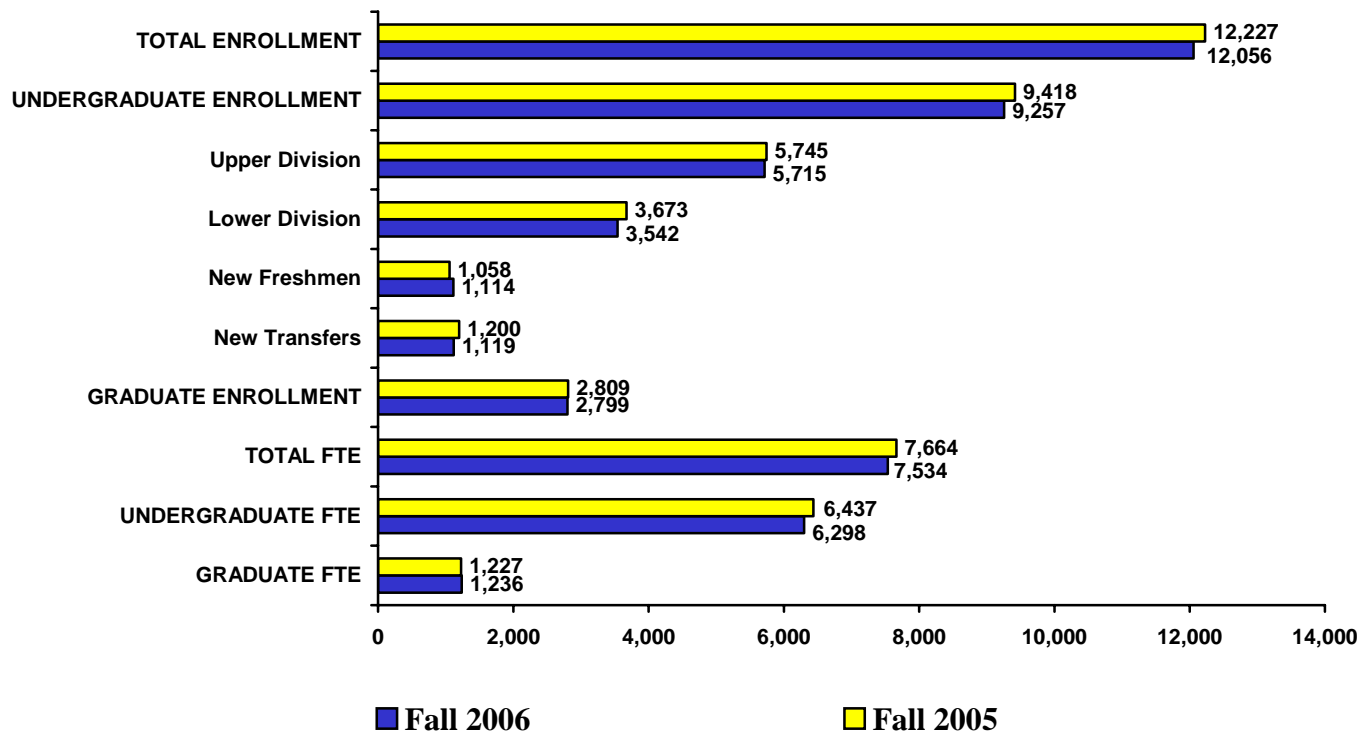


# Enrollment Fact Sheet Fall, 2006

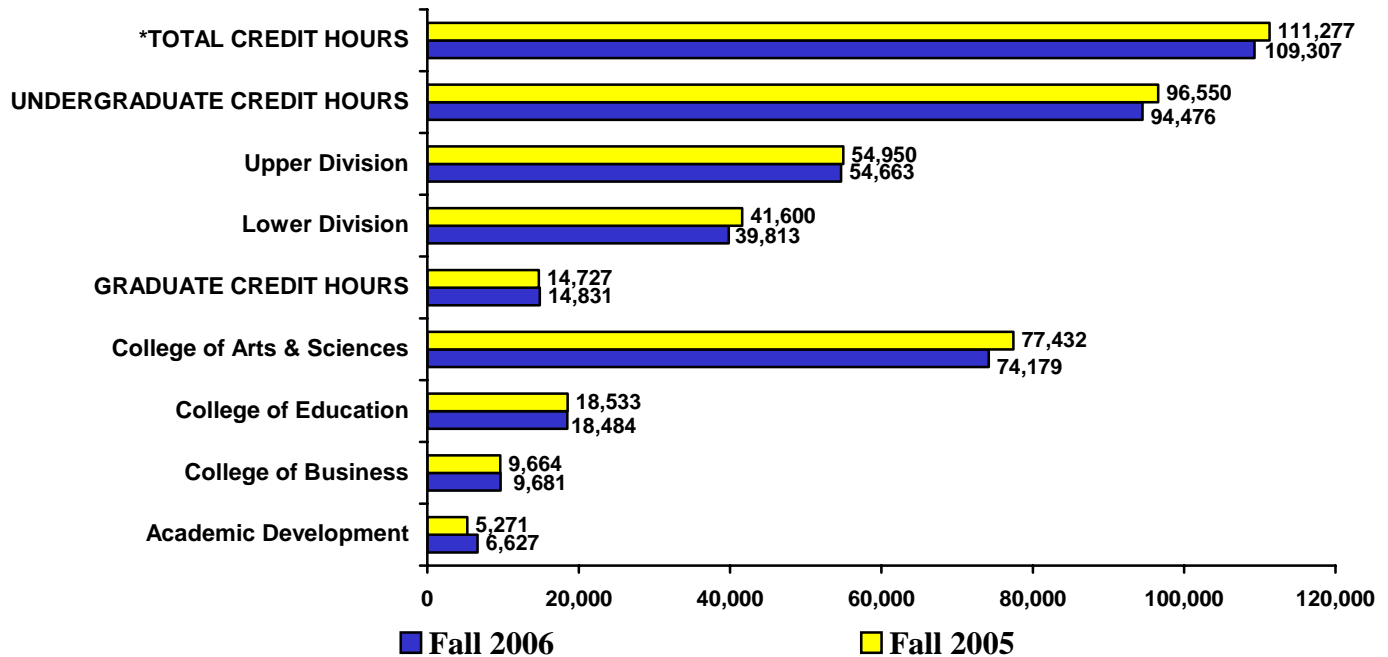
## Comparison of Student Enrollment and FTE



Although this fall saw the first decrease (1.4%) in enrollment in a decade, during the same time period overall enrollment at Northeastern has actually grown 20.1%.

Among the newly enrolled undergraduates, new freshman enrollments increased 5.3%, while the number of new transfer students fell by 6.8%. Even though graduate student enrollment was slightly down, graduate student FTE and student credit hours showed slight increases.

## Comparison of Student Credit Hours by Level and by College

Total credit hour productivity slightly decreased this fall. At the same time, there was a substantial increase in credit hours generated by Academic Development. This 25.7% growth can be attributed to increased enrollment in a new Math Development course.

Slightly more new freshmen in fall 2006 are attending full-time; also this fall, African-American students make up a slightly lower percent (12.5% vs. 10.9%) of new freshmen, while Hispanic students make up a slightly higher percent (38.2% vs. 42.0%) of this population
