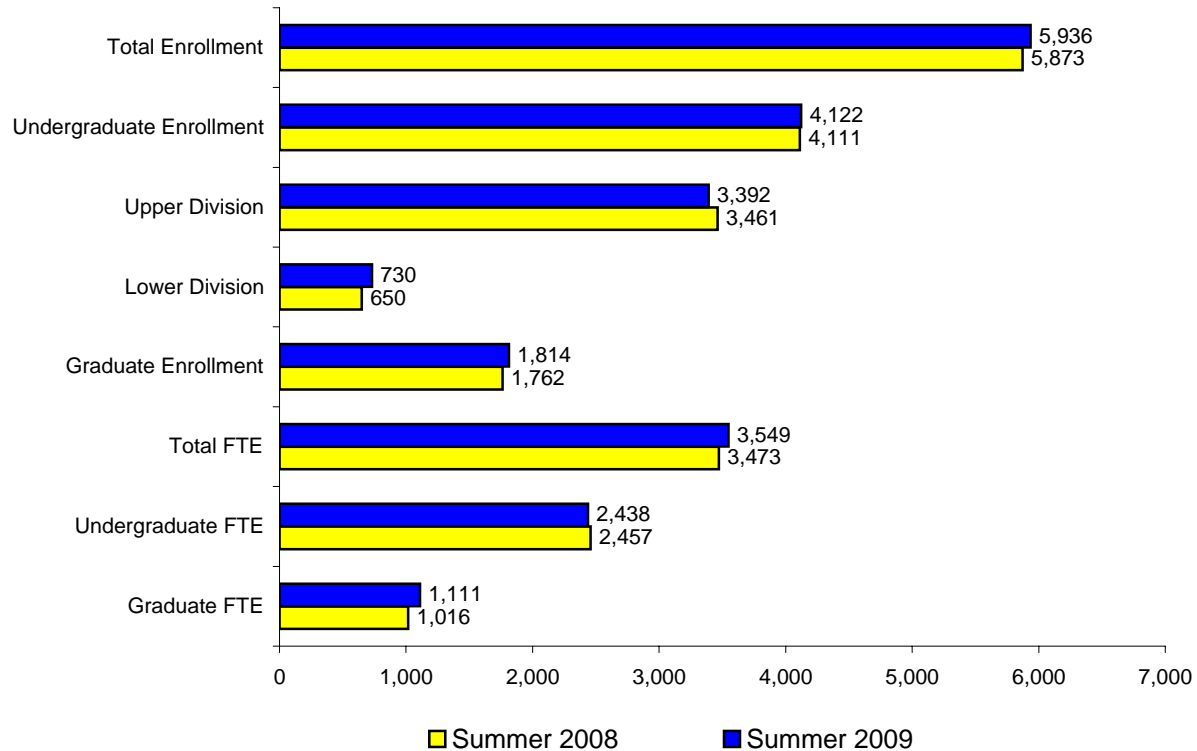

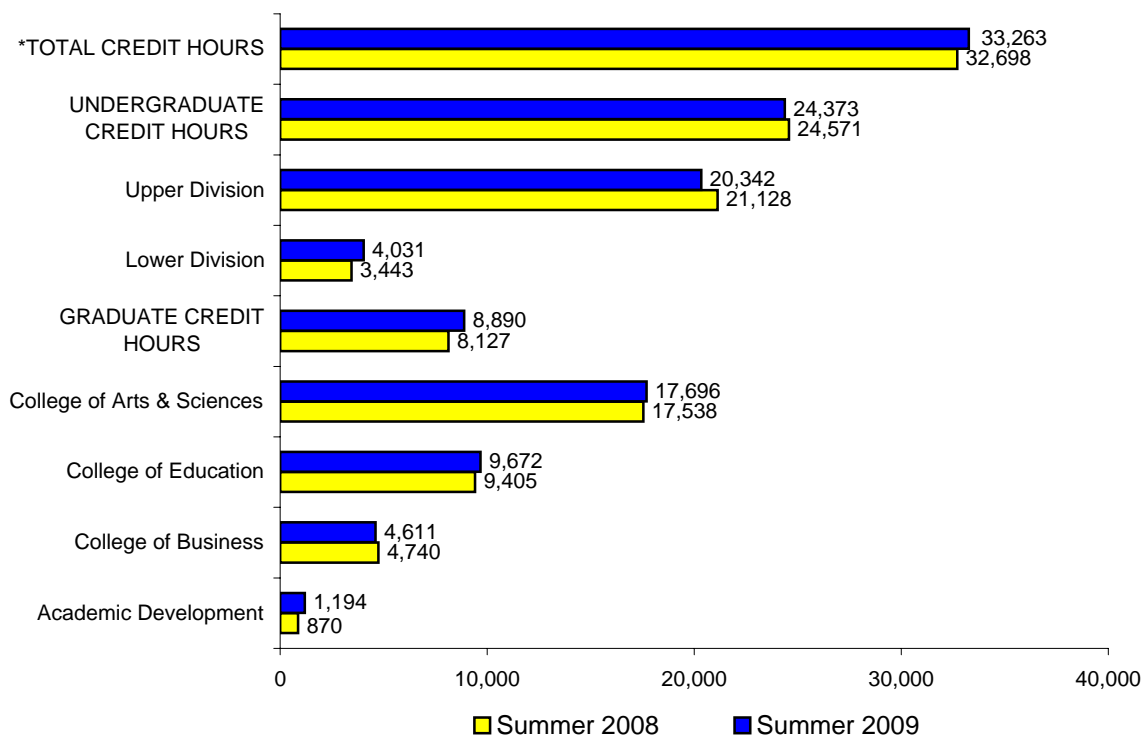

Comparison of Student Enrollment and FTE Summer 2008 - Summer 2009



- ❖ Total enrollment for 2009 Summer session was 5,936. This presents a 1.1% increase from the prior summer; total FTE also increased by 2.2%
- ❖ Undergraduate enrollment stayed fairly constant, with a slight increase of 11 students.
- ❖ The only decrease from Summer 2008 was in upper division, from 3,461 in 2008 to 3,392 in 2009, a 2.0% decrease.

Comparison of Student Hours by Level and by College



*Total Credit Hours includes Honors, NSEP, and non-traditional credit hours.

- ❖ Total credit hours generated during the Summer 2009 sessions increased from the prior summer by 1.7%. This represents a rebound from 2008, nearly restoring the total credit hours to the Summer 2007 level.
- ❖ A drill down shows that the overall increase is largely due to an increase in lower division (17.1%) and graduate credit hours (9.4%), countered by a decrease in upper division credit hours (3.7%).
