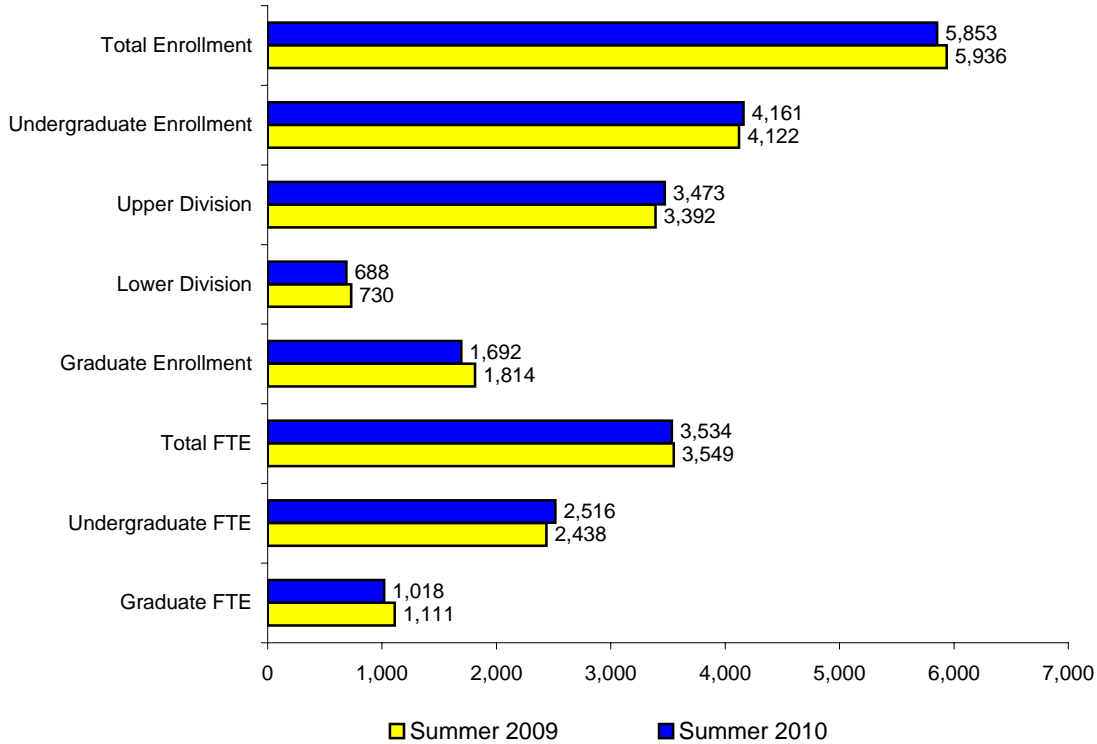

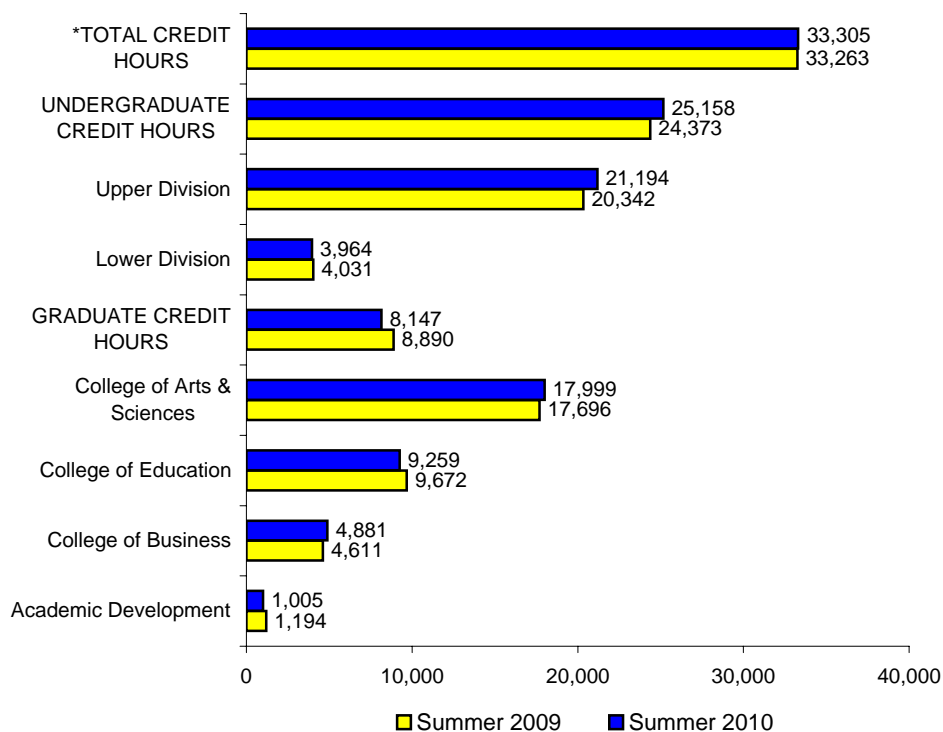

Comparison of Student Enrollment and FTE Summer 2009 - Summer 2010



- ❖ Total enrollment for Summer 2010 was 5,853. This represents a 1.4% decrease from the prior summer; total FTE also decreased by 0.4%
- ❖ Undergraduate enrollment grew slightly from 4,122 in 2009, to 4,161 in 2010, a .09% increase. Undergraduate FTE also increased by 3%.
- ❖ The most substantial increase in enrollment was in upper division, from 3,392 in 2009 to 3,473 in 2010, a 2.4% increase.

Comparison of Student Hours by Level and by College



*Total Credit Hours includes Honors, NSEP, and non-traditional credit hours.

- ❖ Total credit hours generated during the Summer 2010 was fairly flat when compared to Summer 2009, only increasing by 42 credit hours.
- ❖ A drill down shows an increase of 785 in undergraduate credit hours (3.2%), countered by a decrease of 743 in graduate credit hours (8.4%).
