Color for this month is "Brown" and we will talk about shape "Triangle".

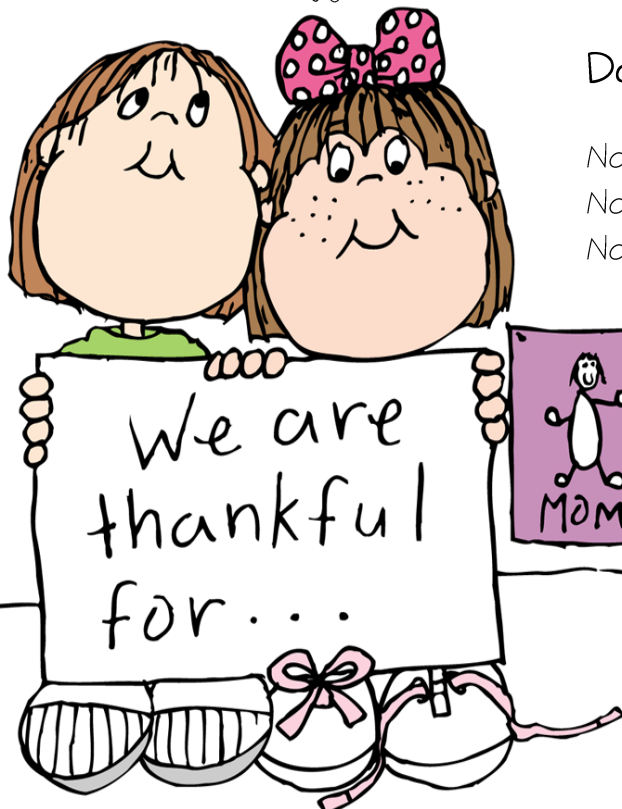
## Discovery Center
