Victim of Human Trafficking – OR – Battered Immigrant Qualified Alien	BRING ONE of the following copy of ORIGINAL documents to the Financial Aid Office: • Your certification letter from Health & Human Services (HHS) and a T-visa (with Title IV benefits verified similar to refugee status) • Your I-797, Notice of Acton form from U.S. Citizenship & Immigration Services (USCIS), with a valid expiration date verifying financial aid eligibility
